is a follow-up to author Carol Kimball's bestselling *Song: A Guide to Art Song Style and Literature*. Rather than a general survey of art song literature, the new book clearly and insightfully defines the fundamental characteristics of art song, and the integral relationship between lyric poetry and its musical settings. Topics covered include poetry basics for singers, exercises for singers in working with poetry, insights into composers' musical settings of poetry, building recital programs, performance suggestions, and recommended literature for college and university classical voice majors. The three

appendices address further aspects of poetry, guidelines for creating a recital program, and representative classical voice recitals of various descriptions. *Art Song: Linking Poetry and Music* is extremely useful as an "unofficial" text for college/university vocal literature classes, as an excellent resource for singers and voice teachers, and of interest to all those who are fascinated by the rich legacy of the art song genre.

The cabin becomes a pressure cooker, filled with tension as the four teenagers wrestle with their anger, fear, resentment and boredom - any one of which could tip the situation into disaster. From the opening moments when Taylor witnesses her sister's autopsy to the final cathartic scene after the two girls

have survived their ordeal, the reader is glued to every page of this frank, gripping and beautifully written novel that raises questions for every teenager. Do you need to be a certain way to get a boyfriend? Can someone who loves you also hurt you? How can a million small compromises eat away at who you are? What happens when you don't think you deserve to be treated well? How do you end up in an abusive relationship, and what keeps you there? Elise Moser goes deeply into the hearts and minds of Lily and Taylor, who in the end save each other in unexpected ways.

In the early days of radio, there were
employment opportunities for women as

that from 1920 to 1936, deLeith received
three million pieces of fan mail, wrote
more than 200 published songs, made
more than 300 phonograph records and
Edison cylinders, and sang 15,000 songs
on the air. The women who worked in and
on radio in its four greatest decades are
given their due in this comprehensive
work. Readers will find Bertha Brainard,
Judith Waller, Jessica Dragonette, Kate
Smith, the Boswell Sisters, the Andrews
Sisters, the Carter Sisters, Wilma Lee
Cooper, Kitty Wells, Gracie Allen, and
Minnie Pearl, among many, many other
women who were on the radio. Nine
extended entries cover pioneers, Mary
Garden and Chicago radio, singers,
country musicians, comedienne, and
husband-and-wife talk shows, women in

daytime serials (soap operas), family

women in radio.
