The Tenth Man Simon and Schuster

The years from 1939 to 1955 proved to be the most prolific of Graham Greene's life. In *The Life of Graham Greene, Volume II*, Norman Sherry continues his engrossing account, delving deeply and emerging with a portrait of the author at the height of both his spying and literary careers. Greene produced some of his best novels during this time - *The Heart of the Matter*, *The End of the Affair*, *The Quiet American* - and saw the filming of *The Fallen Idol* and *The Third Man*. The same period encompasses his passionate affair with the beautiful American Catherine Watson, who was married to a British peer, the disintegration of his marriage, his long relationship with Dorothy Glover, his activities as a secret agent and his forays into the conflicts in Kenya, Malaya, and French Indo-China. Madame Bovary is the French writer Gustave Flaubert's debut novel. Flaubert was a notorious perfectionist and claimed always to be searching for le mot juste

("the precise word"). Madame Bovary takes place in provincial northern France, near the town of Rouen in Normandy. The story begins and ends with Charles Bovary, a stolid, kindhearted man without much ability or ambition. Gustave Flaubert (1821-1880) was an influential French writer who was perhaps the leading exponent of literary realism of his country. The celebrated short story writer Maupassant was a protégé of Flaubert.
