When Michelle was put into a psychiatric hospital for the first time, she was in a critical state. Her self-harming was out of control and her suicidal tendencies made life for her very dangerous. She struggles continually on a day to day basis. In the book *On Knife's Edge* Michelle portrays her struggle in third person through the eyes of Julie. Some references to people in the story are either fictional or exaggerated. Michelle's struggles did not end in hospital. Her intuitive intelligence made it very hard for the nurses to deal with her. Michelle was met by a complete lack of understanding and
