The global medical process is a chain of different medical multidisciplinary procedures. The success in global Patient Safety will depend on the Safety of the consecutive medical processes that intervene in this complex system. Laboratory data is an essential part of health care, indeed it is used in 70% of clinical decisions. Inappropriate laboratory test over requesting is extremely frequent. The prevalence of under requesting has been less studied. The consequences of under requesting are clear, we are missing a diagnosis. Inappropriate over requesting can result not only in a problem of cost but also in a problem regarding patient safety. Additionally, another important consequence of inappropriate tests over requesting is that such amount of unnecessary tests has probably contributed to a significant increase in the volume of those over the last years. In all, there is general consensus that the inadequacy of test requesting must be corrected through strategies and monitored over time through indicators to assure the optimal laboratory contribution to clinical decision-making and patient safety.

In response to a request from the Aviation Life Support Equipment Product Manager (ALSE-PM) of the Aviation Systems Command (AVSCOM), the U.S. Army Aeromedical Research Laboratory (USAARL) conducted an investigation and evaluation of the Prebreather/Portable Oxygen System (P/POS) manufactured by American Safety Flight Systems, Inc. A test of the P/POS was conducted in the hypobaric chamber at the U.S. Army School of Aviation Medicine. Four crews of four subjects each and one crew of three (the last crew had only three because one subject had a middle ear infection) prebreathed 100 percent chamber oxygen for 30 minutes. Then they switched to the P/POS while the chamber was depressurized to 18,000 feet MSL at a rate of 500 fpm. They remained at this altitude pressure until they reduced the P/POS pressure from 1800 psi to 200 psi. Following this, the chamber was repressurized to sea level at a rate of 4000 fpm. Mission durations, percent oxygen saturation and cognitive performance were measured for each subject. The average mission duration was 2 hr 28 min with a standard deviation of 13.9 min. The study indicated the P/POS will meet the needs of all helicopter missions for the Army that do not require prebreathing.

When Andrea Louise Campbell's sister-in-law, Marcella Wagner, was run off the freeway by a hit-and-run driver, she was seven-and-a-half months pregnant. She survived—and, miraculously, the baby was born healthy. But that's where the good news ends. Marcella was left paralyzed from the chest down. This accident was much more than just a physical and emotional tragedy. Like so many Americans—50 million, or one-sixth of the country's population—neither Marcella nor her husband, Dave, who works for a small business, had health insurance. On the day of the accident, she was on her way to class for the nursing program through which she hoped to secure one of the few

remaining jobs in the area with the promise of employer-provided insurance. Instead, the accident plunged the young family into the tangled web of means-tested social assistance. As a social policy scholar, Campbell thought she knew a lot about means-tested assistance programs. What she quickly learned was that missing from most government manuals and scholarly analyses was an understanding of how these programs actually affect the lives of the people who depend on them. Using Marcella and Dave's situation as a case in point, she reveals their many shortcomings in *Trapped in America's Safety Net*. Because American safety net programs are designed for the poor, Marcella and Dave first had to spend down their assets and drop their income to near-poverty level before qualifying for help. What's more, to remain eligible, they will have to stay under these strictures for the rest of their lives, meaning they are barred from doing many of the things middle-class families are encouraged to do: Save for retirement. Develop an emergency fund. Take advantage of tax-free college savings. And, while Marcella and Dave's story is tragic, the financial precariousness they endured even before the accident is all too common in America, where the prevalence of low-income work and unequal access to education have generated vast—and growing—economic inequality. The implementation of Obamacare has cut the number of uninsured and underinsured and reduced some of the disparities in coverage, but it continues to leave too many people open to tremendous risk. Behind the statistics and beyond the ideological battles are human beings whose lives are stunted by policies that purport to help them. In showing how and why this happens, *Trapped in America's Safety Net* offers a way to change it.
