Over the last few decades, many countries have reformed their secured transactions law. One of the main reasons has been the clear link between reform and the

availability of credit, and the drive to improve access to finance, particularly for micro, small and medium-sized enterprises. This book focuses particularly on developing economies in Africa, which have legal frameworks influenced by English, French, Belgian, Roman-Dutch and other laws. Reform in this area of law across African

countries has taken a number of forms, which are explored and discussed in this book.
