International means that it will deal with transactions involving individuals or firms in more than one nation. Logistics means the organized movement of goods, services, and, sometimes, people. Logistics was originally a military term. For example, in author Tom Clancy's novel, *Red Storm Rising*, Russian General Alekseyev thought to himself about a battlefield situation: "The tactics ... no, amateurs discuss tactics. Professional soldiers study logistics. ... 1 When one speaks of the international logistics system, he means that huge array of carriers, forwarders, bankers, traders, and so on that facilitate international transactions, trades, and movements of goods and services. Communications are important, and a logistics system includes whatever communication capability it needs.

The value of goods carried by airlines represents 7.4% of the global Gross Domestic Product. While cargo carried by air accounts for less than 1% of global cargo carriage, airlines carry 35% of the value of world trade, making this industry highly valuable and efficient, and the most

reliable way to transport goods throughout the world. On average, airlines transport 52 million metric tons of goods per annum, worth an equivalent of \$6.8 trillion, i.e. \$18.6 billion worth of goods daily.
