Within recent years pharmaceuticals have come into focus as contaminants of the environment (see for example Kümmerer, K. editor: *Pharmaceuticals in the Environment*). At the same time the issue of sustainable chemistry gained momentum. Bringing both together would result in sustainable pharmacy. Sustainable pharmacy is a totally new issue and approach. It addresses environmental, economical and social aspects of pharmacy. In

the present stage the focus will be on environmental issues along the whole lifecycle of a pharmaceutical entity. How can they contribute to more efficient use of pharmaceuticals with less environmental burden and less risk for drinking water.
